Geology Walks through Time in Shropshire

1: Pre Cambrian

Sunday 19 April, 10.30am
Pontesford & Earl's Hill

This 2-mile walk will focus on the Pre Cambrian strata exposed in the Lyd Hole, a striking circular hollow on the Habberley Brook to the east of Pontesford Hill. There will be an option for the more energetic to walk a further 1.5 miles back over Earl's Hill and examine the PreCambrian volcanic rocks that make up its core. From the top of the hill there will be an opportunity to appreciate Habberley Brook as an ice cut channel and see the former route of the stream to the north east. Mainly footpaths with some steep or rough sections.

This is the first of 6 geology walks visiting important geological sites in the county of Shropshire, in partnership with the Shropshire Geological Society and in celebration of CPRE's centenary year.

All walks start at 10.30 for 11 and aim to be around 2 hours in length. Most will be around 3 to 4 miles in length. After the walks, there will be an option to continue discussions over lunch at a local venue.
